White Slave Panic

 False narrative that immigrants were enticing women into sexual slavery

All Europe, North America, Panama, South America, Egypt and other parts of Africa, India, China and Japan are the fields of operation of these atrocious men and serpentine women.

By no means all the traffickers are French. Many are Jews, many are Italians and Sicilians, some are Austrians, Germans, English, Americans, Greeks But it is Paris that has made vice a fine art, and has made the white slave trade a wide-spread systematized commercial enterprise.

One thing should be made very clear to the girl who comes up to the city, and that is that the ordinary ice cream parlor is very likely to be a spider's web for her entanglement. This is perhaps especially true of those ice cream saloons and fruit stores kept by foreigners. Scores of cases are on record where young girls have taken their first step towards "white slavery" in places of this character. And it is

- The "Mann Act" made it a felony to cross state lines for immoral purposes



Déjà Vu: Transfolks and Grooming

With rising book bans, librarians have come under attack as 'groomers' and 'pedophiles'



Libraries around the country face increasing threats from right-wing activists and extremists who call staff "groomers"—accusing them of pedophilia—because they offer books that feature LGBTQ+ narratives or characters, or host queer-friendly events like <u>drag queen storytimes</u>.

Dozens of libraries have been threatened with bomb or active shooter threats. <u>In Florida</u>, some school bookshelves stand empty, as teachers hide books to avoid felony charges after they were ordered to "remove or cover all classroom libraries until all materials can be reviewed" for "prurient" or "offensive" material. Right-wing activists and <u>Republican lawmakers</u> are attempting to group any books that include LGBTQ+ themes into these criminal definitions.

They have been labeled pedophiles on social media, called out by local politicians and reported to law enforcement officials. Some librarians have quit after being harassed online. Others have been fired for refusing to remove books from circulation.







Stonewall riots began on June 27, 1969 which included singling out drag queens and cross-dressing patrons



Three-piece law

- Laws existed to prevent people from dressing up to cover for another crime
- Other laws existed which prevented someone from wearing clothes "not belonging to his or her sex"
 - This was the case in San Francisco starting in 1863
 - Cross-dressing was used by many sex workers to denote their availability



Déjà Vu: Bans on Drag Performance

Restrictions on drag shows, pride parades in question as Senate approves bill


At least 9 GOP-led state legislatures want to restrict or criminalize drag shows

Tennessee governor signs drag show restrictions into law

Conservative media and Republican lawmakers have claimed that their opposition to drag shows is about protecting children. They often repeat a homophobic trope that drag queens and the LGBTQ community are "grooming" young children.

Comstock and Obscenity

- 1873 Comstock Act was passed
 - Defined contraceptives as obscene and illicit
 - Federal offence to mail or bring across state lines birth control
 - Made it illegal to sell, publish, or possess an obscene book but did not define obscenity

Supreme Court decision suggests the legal right to contraception is also under threat

Birth control restrictions could follow abortion bans, experts say



The Lavender Scare

- President Eisenhower's Executive Order 10450 signed in 1953
- Conflated homosexuals with communists
- Fear that gay men and lesbians posted a threat to national security

Déjà Vu: Threats of Employment

Lawrence said the anger of some community members focused on library director Amber McLain. Several people brought up that McLain is gay. One questioned, "Is she even Christian?" McLain recounted in an email response to questions from Bridge

"I had to change my name on Facebook for a time to prevent messages that were starting to come in," McLain wrote.

"I never read any of them fully, but it was the typical fare — that I'm evil, that I'm indoctrinating kids. In March, a woman came into the library filming on her cell phone. She said she was looking for 'that pedophile librarian' and 'the freak with the pink hair," which library staff presumed referred to McLain because the library director had dyed her hair pink.

McLain said she was not in the library at the time.

Soon afterward, she resigned.

Institut für Sexualwissenschaft

- Pioneer in research on gender and sexuality, including homosexuality, transgender, and intersex issues
- Provided sex education, including sexually transmitted infections and contraception
- Large library related to gender and same-sex relationships



German Student Union

- Students from the Deutsche Studentenschaft broke into the building with a brass band accompanied them
- The sang the anthem of the Nazi party
- Destroyed thousands of items by blacklisted authors



- 4 days later the remaining items in the library and archives were taken outside and burned
- 40,000 people listened to a speech by Joseph Goebbels
- Other books were burned, but just ones from the institute
